



ROVIGO

PALAZZO ROVERELLA

In 1474 the old and powerful Cardinal Bartolomeo Roverella, built the majestic palace in the style of the Este facing Rovigo's main square. With its greatness it testified the great prestige achieved by the Roverella family, settled in Ferrara, but originally from homonymous locality between Rovigo and Lendinara. Current home to the art collections of both the Accademia dei Concordi and the Episcopal Seminary, the palace is home to a rich display of works of the original Silvestri collection, put together with paintings from various churches of Polesine, as well as exhibitions of national prestige. Important artworks by Pietro Vecchia, Pietro Bellotti, Sebastiano Bombelli, Bernardo Strozzi, Elisabetta Marchioni, Fra' Galgario, Luca Giordano, Antonio Molinari, Giambattista Piazzetta, Pietro Longhi, Gaspare Diziani and Felice Cignaroli. Of great interest the painted terracotta altarpiece attributed to Michele da Firenze depicting a Madonna with Child and Saints (1436), from the church of Raccano.
